Despite our ups and downs, Kokoweef is still progressing and the work is getting done thanks to the fulltime volunteer efforts of Tom Beck, Gale Aumock and Bob Lauten. In order to keep you fully informed as to our progress, we have included a diagram-map of current and proposed tunneling projects at Kokoweef. This map is on page 2.

At 1 on this map is shown the 90 feet of tunneling which Tom and Gale completed at the time this map was first drawn. To date, we have tunneled in 110 feet and figure we are within 30 to 50 feet of Schnarrd's Hole. We have also begun probing out at 45 degree angles on both sides of this tunnel. With your continued financial support, we will be able to complete the remaining 6 objectives associated with this project.

At 2 is a known fault from the upper caverns which intersects the fault we are now following. This is significant because wherever faultlines intersect, lie the greatest potential for natural passages leading to the larger caverns below -- AND TO EARL P. DORR'S "RIVER OF GOLD." At 3, the tunnel will be driven 15 feet below

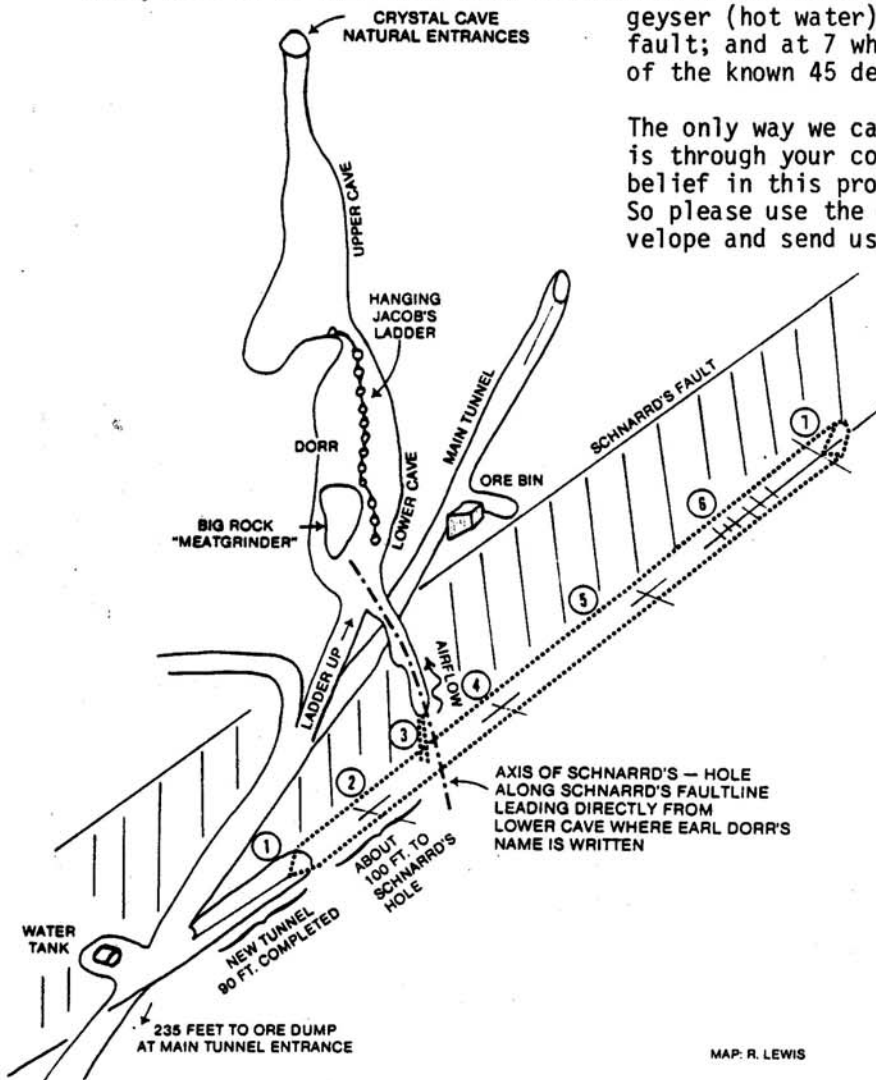
FUTURE OBJECTIVES CAN BE ACCOMPLISHED WITH YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT

the debris-plugged bottom of Schnarrd's Hole. Tunneling straight along Schnarrd's faultline to the bottom of Schnarrd's Hole is important for 5 reasons: (1) Dorr had DIRECT ACCESS to Schnarrd's Hole (a natural passage) from the lower cavern; in fact, Dorr's name can still be seen written on the wall of the lower cave; (2) there is a distinct AIR FLOW coming UP from the bottom of Schnarrd's Hole which is a good indication for caverns below; (3) in the long run, it is much easier and more practical to clear plugged passages from below, thus making gravity work for us, rather than bucketing debris up by hand against gravity and through twisting passages; (4) any future, major excavation downward could be undertaken properly with cable winches and within adequate working spaces; and (5) the four other major potential objectives along Schnarrd's Hole, indicated on the diagram-map below, could then be undertaken by tunneling straight ahead, thus accomplishing the MOST exploration for the LEAST amount of money and in the easiest and most complete manner.

The other four major potentials are at 4 which is a KNOWN vertical fault seen from the upper levels; at 5 where Clarke's Hole faultline and Schnarrd's Hole faultline intersect; at 6 which is a wide area located below the KNOWN White Rooms that were formed by geyser (hot water) activity along Schnarrd's fault; and at 7 where there is an intersection of the known 45 degree fault with Schnarrd's fault.
