Cool Camp Kokoweef: All the Comforts of Home

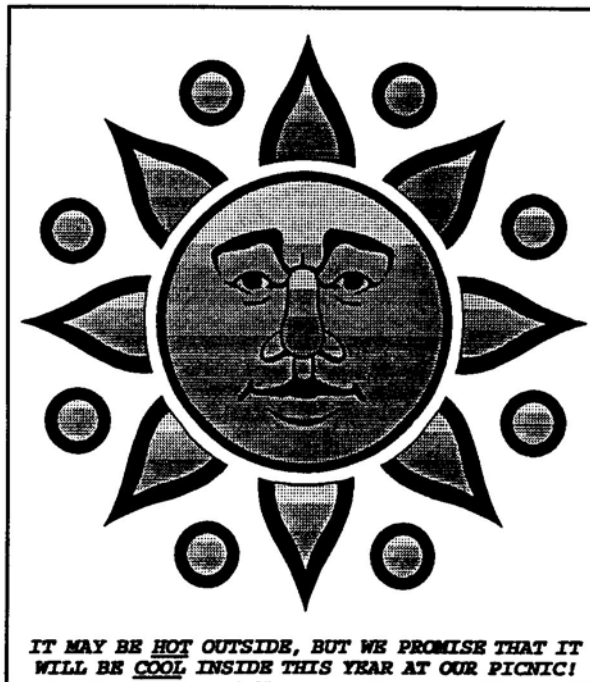

Crew Learns to Use Seismic Equip

Our crew is continuing to learn and develop the seismic equipment.

Training is dictated by the engineers who can come down only on weekends to work with our crew.

Soon, though, we'll have someone trained who will be able to help run our computers.

We are getting data coming in, but to get it faster, we spent \$2,000 to upgrade the computer.

We may also have to upgrade the sensors, but we'll discuss this at the Picnic, after we accumulate more data.

Although our crew is learning as much about the seismic as they can, we're expecting to get an expert field man shortly.

This person will be able to tell us exactly where sensors should be placed, what their arrangements should be, how much dynamite and how big a charge we need to set to get the best results.

Such precise field work is mandatory if we are to get the most accurate results possible.

We also have two outfits coming down with ground penetra-

ting radar. One outfitter contends he can operate at 150 to 200 feet to find voids; the other says he can detect voids at 250 to 300 feet.

They will be here before or during our Picnic, and we'll analyze what they have to say then.

We're continuing to diamond drill in patterns to see if we can either identify faults or come up with some kind of void system.

We've also finally repaired all of our equipment.
